Between the support of Shire of Waroona, Alcoa and Bendigo Bank the fire recognition event was held on Friday 12th May. Although numbers were a little low on the night, it never the less was pleasing for me to acknowledge the efforts of all those who assisted in the control of the January fire, which was our most serious fire in recent times.

FIRE RECOGNITION SUNDOWNER

Friday the 15th of May, the Shire of Waroona hosted the 'Fire Recognition Sundowner' at the Memorial Hall. The event was in praise of all the volunteers who selflessly gave their services during the January fires.

The fires widely affected the township of Waroona with areas surrounding Forrington Heights and Lyons Road under immense threat and parts of the town being forced to evacuate. During this time, the effort from local fire brigades, community groups, local business and individuals was immeasurable. DFES and many surrounding fire brigades contributed but without the local volunteers the outcome could have been very different.

Supported by the Shire of Waroona, Alcoa and Bendigo Bank the night provided an opportunity for the residents in the affected areas to formally recognise those who assisted during this period.

As unfortunate as the circumstances were surrounding the January fire, it was great to see the sense of community and morale. Our local volunteers are essential to our community and it was great to be able to dedicate a night to recognise the time and effort they put in to ensure Waroona, Hamel, Lake Clifton and Preston Beach are all kept safe.



RANGER RESOURCE SHARING

The Council at its Ordinary meeting held May 26th 2015 has endorsed a proposal to enter into a shared arrangement with the Shire of Murray to provide its rangers services.

As well as significant cost savings (in the order of \$80,000 annually) the Shire will have access to a larger ranger pool, 7 days per week services, a structured year round roster system and access to the latest mobile technology.

In addition the service will operate on a single telephone number which will be monitored after hours by a Local Government Call Centre. A response matrix will then be used to determine the appropriate response.

Shire President Councillor Christine Germain stated that this initiative is another in a series of services which have been shared with a neighbouring Council." It is extremely important that we are proactive in achieving the best results for ratepayers and residents. At the end of the day if we do not provide the most cost effective services it is Council rates that must bear the burden."

The Council will provide updated information within its newsletter and website as the service develops.

COMPULSORY MICROCHIPPING FOR ALL DOGS

Dog owners are reminded that from 1st November 2015 it is compulsory for all dogs to be microchipped. When a person registers their dog, they will be required to provide proof that the dog has been microchipped by providing the microchip number.
