Illegal Residential Structures and Camping in the Shire of Waroona

faced by many, the Shire of Waroona has noted an increase in individuals setting up temporary accommodations, including tents, caravans, and sheds on their properties. We understand the current challenges of finding affordable housing are impacting many.

The regulations in Western Australia limit camping on one's land to three days within a 28-day period and do not permit residing in structures like tents, caravans and sheds, as they are considered non-residential. The Shire regularly conducts compliance checks to ensure that everyone is living in safe and approved conditions. Our primary concern is the health, safety, and well-being of our community. The Ellenbrook Art Award, an annual contest and exhibition, is organised by Ellenbrook Arts in collaboration with the City of Swan. The announcement of this year's winners took place during the exhibition's opening on 8 September.

> "I am elated and honoured to have received the prestigious Overall Award," Carmen said when asked what the win meant to her. "And I can't explain how proud I am seeing textiles take the spotlight in this competition."

Another of Carmen's passions is creating delicate flora sculptures in cold porcelain. These superb pieces, made to her exacting standards, bring to life the flowers, leaves, nuts, and berries of the Australian bush in garlands and jewellery.

Carmen operates from a home studio where she welcomes visitors by appointment. Her creations can also be found at the Waroona Visitor Centre where she is a volunteer, and where you will find her demonstrating her various crafts one day per month.

Adoption of Local Planning Policy 17 – Vegetation

On 26 September 2023, Council resolved to adopt the above local planning policy.

The purpose of this Policy is to provide a clear vision, approach and expectation for development and land use that may disturb or clear vegetation in rural and urban areas. This Policy applies to native and some non-native vegetation. It provides a greater level of protection and encourages a net gain in vegetation coverage.
