This award is for innovative environmental advocacy and awareness programs. I would like to take the opportunity to thank former Cr. PRESTON BEACH COMMUNITY CENTRE REDEVELOPMENT

The redevelopment of the Preston Beach Community Centre on Panorama Drive moved ahead on Friday 27 October with a local workshop held to understand the community's needs for the building. The workshop was attended by CEO Ian Curley, senior Shire staff, MCG Architects, Preston Beach Progress Association representatives and other community members.

With the information received at the workshop, MCG Architects will draft concept designs that will be further discussed with community representatives. Once the building design has been finalised, the project will progress to a tender process in order to appoint a builder.

Funding for the project has been confirmed from the Shire of Waroona, the WA State Government Royalties for Regions Fund and the Alcoa Waroona Sustainability Fund and we are currently waiting on the outcome of an application for funds from Lotterywest.
