SHIRE OF WAROONA LOCAL PLANNING SCHEME NO. 7, AMENDMENT 40

Planning and Development Act 2005 Local Planning Scheme 7 Amendment 40 – Available for Inspection

Notice is hereby given that the local government of the Shire of Waroona has prepared the above mentioned Local Planning Scheme Amendment for the purpose of amending the following provisions in Schedule A – Supplementary Provisions:

- 1. Modifying Clause 61(1)(s) of Schedule A Supplementary Provisions to read: 61(1)(s) The erection or extension of a single house on a lot where shown as a "P" use in the Zoning Table and all other requirements of the Scheme are met.
- 2. Modifying Clause 61(1)(t) of Schedule A Supplementary Provisions to read: 61(1)(t) The erection or extension of an ancillary dwelling, outbuilding, external fixture, boundary wall or fence, patio, pergola, veranda, garage, carport or swimming pool on the same lot as a single house where shown as a "P" use in the Zoning Table and all other requirements of the Scheme are met.

Documents setting out and explaining the Amendment are available for inspection during office hours at the offices of the Shire of Waroona, 52 Hesse Street, Waroona.

Submissions on the Local Planning Scheme Amendment may be made in writing and lodged to the Shire of Waroona on or before 2 January 2019. SAFETALK WORKSHOPS

Last year the Shire received funding from the Mental Health Commission to facilitate suicide prevention training within the community. The first of these trainings was held last week, with a safeTALK workshop delivered to Year 10 students at Waroona District High School.

safeTALK is a half-day alertness workshop that prepares anyone over the age of 15, regardless of prior experience or training, to become a suicide-alert helper. Most people with thoughts of suicide don't truly want to die, but are struggling with the pain in their lives. Through their words and actions, they invite help to stay alive. safeTALK-trained helpers can recognize these invitations and take action by connecting them with life-saving intervention resources, such as caregivers trained in ASIST.

Since its development in 2006, safeTALK has been used in over 20 countries around the world, and more than 200 selectable video vignettes have been produced to tailor the program's audio-visual component for diverse audiences. safeTALK-trained helpers are an important part of suicide-safer communities, working alongside intervention resources to identify and avert suicide risks

Given the success of this workshop, a community workshop will be organised for the near future. Watch this space!

WYLD PROGRAM - SESSION 3

Last month was the third session of the Waroona Youth Leadership Development (WYLD) Program. This is a 12 month youth engagement program that has been created for young people living in Waroona by zero2hero in partnership with the Shire of Waroona.

The WYLD Program features activities held on the last Friday night of each month at the Waroona Recreation & Aquatic Centre that are fun and engaging, inspirational and empowering, and challenging and physical. The sessions are free and include dinner.

This session engaged with young people aged between 10 and 19 years of age at the Waroona Recreation & Aquatic Centre with astronomy, campfire and bush survival tasks.

Local businesses and community organisations continue to request to be involved in the program, offering sponsorships and donations. Session #4 will be held on Friday, 21st December, and will feature campfire and convo's activities.

INTERAGENCY

Last week, the bimonthly Waroona Interagency Group meeting was held at the Waroona Community Resource Centre.

There was a great attendance of 29 members, representing a variety of government agencies, community organisations and health service providers, who provided an insight into their roles and organisations.

The team from East Metropolitan Health Service provided a presentation on their new program "Yarn It Up - Don't Smoke It Up", followed by Peel Development Commission who provided an overview of the Regional Economic Development Program and Building Better Regions Fund.

Following the presentations, the group took the opportunity to network and access support to work towards the common goals of delivering community services and addressing issues around community safety and wellbeing. Waroona Interagency Group now boasts a database over 70 representatives from over 50 stakeholders including local governments, government agencies, health service providers and community organisations.
