STATE SPORTING ASSOCIATION & LOCAL GOVERNMENT FORUM

On Wednesday 8th May, the Peel and South West offices of the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries hosted a forum for State Sporting Associations (SSA) and Local Governments (LG) as a means of creating networks and developing relationships between the sports and the facility providers.

It has been recognised that as sports continue to grow, pressure mounts on local governments to supply the level of facilities & equipment needed. In many instances, the relationship between the two parties are minimal which can result in the misunderstanding of community need and opportunities can be missed.

The hosting of this initial forum, connected local governments from both the Peel and South West with key state sporting associations - Cricket WA, Hockey WA, Basketball WA, Football West, Netball WA and WA Football Commission. This forum provided an opportunity for the state sporting associations to present on regional servicing priorities as well as outline potential restrictions. Following the presentations, local governments were able to engage in discussion with the sports relevant to their communities. This forum provided a foundation for both sport and local government to develop appropriate networks that will benefit into the future, particularly with regards to planning of facility needs.

Following the success of this forum, it has been suggested that the forum be held twice a year, with state sporting associations hosting and presenting at one, and local governments hosting and presenting at the other
