Council was fortunate enough at our last council meeting to be visited by the South West Superintendent of Police, Mr Mick Sutherland.

He was joined by our local Officer in Charge, Mr Simon Bennett and between the officers we learnt of some of the issues which are keeping our Police force busy both locally and in the broader region. Our local force are currently doing a great job and we commend them on some of the initiatives our Officer

in Charge has implemented in our Shire and for the work they do which at times can be dangerous and very demanding.

Quambie Park's nine new independent living units and social hub are very close to completion and will be ready for some new occupants very soon. These new units will be a welcome addition to the organisation and have some great features built in to them around ageing and disability. With the start of the financial year comes the focus for council on the forthcoming year's budget. This is always regarded as a tough job matching income with expenditure for council as maintaining assets and providing ongoing services to our residents are the

very basic functions of a Shire council. The many different areas in which the Council is involved are all aspects in respect to spending in the budget and I can say that this list has not diminished. Our budget is set for adoption in August and a lot of preliminary work will be conducted in the lead up to that point.

For a number of years Council has been approached regarding the crossing of the South West Highway in respect to safety. Many individuals and groups have advocated for a cross walk or a designated safe area to cross. Main Roads WA control management of the highway and are not in favour of crosswalks on highways so Council has moved a motion to see if we can limit the speed just in the centre of town to 40k. I believe this would have broad community support and may be some compromise

in achieving a safer crossing for our residents and not significantly impeding our motorists. This is in very early stages of discussion and hopefully we may get some action on this issue in the near future.

## PRESTON BEACH DUNE RESTORATION

The Shire of Waroona, in partnership with the Preston Beach Progress Association, completed for the ninth year in a row the Preston Beach Dune Restoration Project. The dune restoration project is achieved with an annual planting day and dune brushing.


Dune brushing reduces dune erosion and subsequently stabilises the dune blowouts at Preston Beach. Stockpiled native green waste is re-used for brushing, which is strategically placed on the dunes to prevent four-wheel drive access to the established hind dunes both north and south of

The annual planting day was held on the 18th June and was attended by the year seven and eight Bush Rangers from the Waroona District High School. The students were successful in planting 500 seedlings in the dunes north of the Preston Beach Green Waste Drop-off area. The day finished with a sausage sizzle provided by the Preston Beach General Store.

The success of the project is attributed to the ongoing support of the Waroona community. Therefore, the Shire of Waroona would like to thank the Preston Beach Progress Association and the Waroona District High School for their continued support and participation in this fun and environmentally sensitive project.

# **Hard Refuse** Collection

The Shire of Waroona's Hard Refuse Collection will be taking place in August and any of the following items will be collected:

- White goods (stoves, washing machines, fridges/ freezers - doors must be removed for safety purposes).

- Scrap metal · General junk (furniture and general house hold items)

## The collection dates are:

Preston Beach town site / Lake Clifton **Commencing Monday 12th August 2019** Waroona & Hamel town sites **Commencing Tuesday 20th August 2019** 

Residents are encouraged to check if their property is within the service zone by referring to the maps located at the Shire Administration Office, Library, Preston Beach General Store, Preston Beach Community Centre and Lake Clifton Community Centre. Information is also available on

our website. It is important that residents pay close attention to the requirements of verge collections. Non-compliance with these requirements may result in some of the waste remaining on the verge and or a possible infringement notice being issued in accordance with the Litter Act 1979. The Shire requests that residents place all waste in four separate neat piles on the verge as per the guidelines on the verge no earlier than one week prior to the dates above. The maximum volume of hard refuse to be collected from each residence is two cubic metres.
