The workshops have been well attended and very positive. Preparations on Peppermint Grove Road continue for the widening and correction of the curves just before the pine plantation. This section of road has had its issues over the years so with the installation of a widened culvert on the eastern bend and better vision on the curves, this can only make this section safer.

The opening was a special occasion with many valued friends of Quambie attending and it was a fitting celebration to everyone that has been involved in seeing this new build come to completion. They have managed the markets admirably for the Lions Club for some time but they will now take over ownership and direction so please support them in running this event and embrace some of the new thinking that they may bring to the markets.

From Council's perspective, we have certainly embraced the new arrangement with Murray Shire and some of the benefits in our sharing agreement are starting to have tangible benefits. Savings in the areas of employment costs are starting to free up some of the budget to help us to direct some money back into the community. Since the start of our resource sharing with Murray Shire, I feel the community has been very open to giving it a chance and from most of the feedback I have received, the support has been very positive. I'm genuinely hoping that this arrangement remains successful well into the future and this model will be held up as path for other councils to follow in allowing communities to retain their independence and locally based decision making but still delivering the services they need too in a sustainable format.

At the end of December we will be farewelling Louis Fouche. Louis has been with the Shire for 9 years and has been responsible for planning and direction in his time with us. Louis has had significant input into council during his employment and the Shire thanks him sincerely for his professionalism and advice as a director. We all wish him well in the future.

WAROONA COUNCIL TO HOLD COUNCIL MEETINGS IN OTHER TOWNS IN OUR SHIRE IN 2020

The Waroona Shire Council has resolved to host meetings outside of the Waroona Council Chambers in 2020.

There will be one Council meeting held on the fourth Tuesday of every month commencing February from 4.00pm.

While the March to July and September to December meetings will be held at the Waroona Council Chambers, the February meeting will be held at the Preston Beach Community Centre, with the August meeting to be held at the Lake Clifton Community Centre.

Shire President, Cr Mike Walmsley welcomed this decision and was pleased to see this re-instigated.

"Having meetings in our other towns allows closer engagement with the community and allows those who may not be able to attend a meeting in Waroona to attend and participate".

"Council feel this is a good way to engage with the residents outside of the more formal setting of the Council Chamber".

"We look forward to seeing as many people as possible attend our Council meetings. We encourage the public to attend our meetings, and in particular, it will be good to have residents from Preston Beach and Lake Clifton attend these meetings in their towns'.
