The role of the organization is to lead, facilitate and advance the delivery of key tourism outcomes for the Mandurah and Peel Region. Utilising best practice destination development, it is expected that the organization will take a lead role in tourism development and marketing and act as a facilitator and advocate for destination planning and management access the region.

Litter fines increase In an effort to minimise case of offences

the amount of littering that continues to occur in our great state of Western Australia, the Keep Australia Beautiful Council (KABC) and the Department of Environment and Conservation have strengthened the law that deals with these offences. The Litter Act 1979 and the Litter Regulations 1981 have been amended to give KABC more tools to be able to tackle littering.

A summary of key changes include:

- The fine for an individual who litters a cigarette butt goes up from \$75 to \$200
- · Increase in the maximum fine for littering offences to \$5000 for individuals and \$10000 for corporations, or in the

against litter regulations, \$5000 for both individuals and corporations

- · In cases of littering from vehicles, to deem the person responsible for the vehicle to have committed the offence where neither the litterer nor the driver of the vehicle can be identified
- · A new offence of 'littering that creates a public risk' will carry an infringement penalty of \$500 and a prosecution maximum of \$5000

The Shire, through Ranger Services is embarking on an awareness campaign to work proactively with the community in dealing with this issue all Councils face.

National Broadband Network.

Councillors and staff will meet with representatives from NBN in February to so have set the benchmark discuss plans for the roll

out of the network within the Shire of Waroona. It is anticipated that Waroona and Preston Beach townsites will be serviced by fibre optic and that lower population areas not covered by the fibre optic, e.g. Lake Clifton, will be serviced by the fixed wireless network. In order to meet this requirement, two new installations will be needed, one at Old Bunbury Road, Lake Clifton and the other to be sited at 147 Coronation Road, Waroona.

Staff Farewell.

Sadly, we recently said farewell to two highly respected staff members, Tamara Olsson and Karen Obom both of whom have moved on to further their respective careers. Tamara has accepted a position as the Deputy CEO with the Shire of Bruce Rock and Karen taking a position as a Project Co-ordinator at Murdoch University. 
Local Residents Help Out

Over the weekend of the 5th and 6th of January a member of the public managed to undo the link that secures the swimming pontoon in place at the weir and caused the pontoon to drift to shore. Shire Worker Mark Wake, with the assistance of two local residents Brian Taylor and Todd McCall spent several hours securing the pontoon back to the original location on Wednesday 9th January.

Before the pontoon was re-secured Mark installed new warning signage and painted the deck. The pontoon was constructed by McCall Bros and Todd assisted with the installation of the pontoon back in November 2011 ready for the official opening of the weir upgrades in April last year.

The weir has modern and safe facilities for all to enjoy. This includes the pontoon, retaining walls and reticulated lawns, shelters and seating area, an improved swimming area, with beach sand, solar lighting, well constructed walk trail, barbeque facilities, shady parking and upgraded toilet facilities. The Shire takes great pride in this location and hopes all visitors and residents can enjoy and respect it too.

The pontoon is secured to ensure that it is in a safe location throughout the year and visible in the main swimming area. The Shire would like to thank Mark, Brain and Todd for their help in securing the pontoon so everyone can enjoy this great facility.

Shire of Waroona Ranger, Sarah Cope is firmly of the opinion that years of hard work and dedication by Shire Rangers, strongly supported by the Preston Beach Volunteer Rangers has ensured a positive and successful outcome for not only the environment at Preston Beach but also for the many beach goers who frequent this popular spot. The rules for this beach are simple, stay out of the dunes, no camping, no fires and no litter. Ouad bikes, ATVs and motor bikes are not permitted. 4WDs must be registered and drivers licensed.

According to Sarah and the volunteer rangers, this recent busy holiday period has highlighted the positive outcome of having a strong, regular and visible ranger presence on our beach with the vast majority of beach users electing to do the right thing and this in turn ensures that the beach is a much more friendly, and importantly, safe environment. Over this summer period littering has been minimal, quads and bikes are rare and the few that have decided to test their luck and ventured into the dunes have expressed surprise at how quickly they were caught. These dunes are fragile and the Shire has a firm, no tolerance approach to this type of activity. The only downside would have to be, a small minority who think it is ok to speed. This practice is not only irresponsible it is also extremely dangerous. The Shire of Waroona has a strong commitment to protecting our strip of coast and in addition to
