HUNTING & GATHERING - GRANT WRITING WORKSHOP

On Thursday 28 March, the Shire collaborated with Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries, to host a grant writing workshop at the Waroona Recreation and Aquatic Centre. The session was well attended with 14 local community organisations and sporting clubs coming along to improve their 'hunting and gathering' skills. Kim Buttfield facilitated the workshop and provided attendees with their own take home template plan for how to apply for grants and sponsorships. A workshop evaluation found that attendees rated the session as an average of 3.8/4 and all stated that they would recommend the session to others.

The Shire is looking to host other club development workshops like this in the future, so watch this space!
