# Shire President's Message

#### **BUDGET ADOPTION**

By the time you read this the budget for 2015/2016 financial year would have been approved by Council. Always a very hard time of the year both for Staff, in preparing the budget and for the Councillors, trying to accommodate both the strategic plan and the community needs and wants, with the funds available. It is pleasing to see a large road construction program for this year. Additional funds have been provided via the Federal Government's Roads to Recovery program which has assisted with deferred projects being brought forward.

#### COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT GRANTS

The Shire of Waroona is transferring its application period for the Community Development Grants Program to February/ March 2016. The grants have traditionally been open for applications in September of the current financial year. I encourage all community groups to apply and by moving the date of application it will allow for off season clubs and other not for profit groups to apply with new projects.

#### ALCOA WAROONA SUSTAINABILITY FUND

Please be aware that the Alcoa Waroona Sustainability fund will be open to local groups and organisations to apply for grant funding beginning August 2015 with applications closing 9th October 2015. This is a fantastic opportunity for groups to fund additional facilities or upgrade those facilities already in place within the Shire of Waroona. 
#### **BULK RUBBISH**

#### **2015/16 RATE NOTICES**

Shire of Waroona rate notices will start to arrive in letterboxes commencing the week of 11th August. This mail out is the initial rates run for the 2015/16 financial year with rate payments due by the 18th September 2015. Council continues to make it as convenient as possible to pay rates with a range of instalment and payment options available. Tip passes will be attached to the base of all notices where the ratepayer is paying a service fee for rubbish and recycling. Ratepayers who own a rural property with a dwelling will be required to collect their rural tip pass from the Shire of Waroona Administration Office.

In addition to your rate notices, your envelope will also contain an information booklet which will include all you need to know about your local Shire. To assist in the rates process, please ensure your current mailing address is correct. Ratepayers who have not received their rate notices as a result of change of address (change of address is required in writing) will continue to be subject to debt recovery action for late payment of rates. It is your responsibility to contact us should you not receive your notice.

Should you be eligible for a pension/seniors rebate on your property please ensure you application is submitted as soon as possible. To be eligible for a 50% pension rebate you must hold a current pension concession card or a commonwealth seniors health card and a seniors card. To be eligible for a 25% seniors rebate you must hold a current seniors card. To be eligible you must be the owner of the property and reside there as your permanent place of address as at the 1st July 2015. You may also apply for a rebate on your Shire rates by calling the Water Corporation on 1300 659 951.

#### **COUNCIL BUDGET 2015/16**

The Shire of Waroona budget for 2015/16 was adopted by the Council at the special meeting held on 4th August 2015. The budget is prepared in conjunction with the Council Community Strategic and Long Term Financial Plans. The adopted rate increase of 7.95% is also in accordance with these plans

Roadworks have a high focus for the year with several significant upgrade projects confirmed. This includes the replacement of the Coronation Road Bridge (\$800,000) and reconstruction of road approaches (\$177,000). In addition Dorsett Road (\$555,000) and Buller Road (\$336,500) will also

The largest infrastructure project will be an upgrade to the Memorial Hall (kitchen and external works) at a cost of \$147,378. A Royalties for Region Grant of \$80,000 has contributed to this project.

### **LOCAL GROUPS BENEFIT FROM WAGERUP** SUSTAINABILITY FUND PAYMENTS

Several local groups are in the process of being notified that they are the successful recipients of \$339,840 in grants from the Wagerup Sustainability Fund, a fund contributed to by Alcoa Australia and held by Perpetual. The local Alcoa Waroona Sustainability Fund Advisory Committee called for applications for funding earlier this year and the following grants have been approved -

Waroona Lions Club \$15840 towards the purchase of a mobile cool room; Preston Beach Volunteer Bushfire Brigade \$20,000 towards CCTV for their new fire station; Quambie Park Waroona Inc. \$90,000 towards the refurbishment of 4 resident bedrooms and bathrooms; Waroona Men's Shed Inc. \$90,000 towards the construction of a purpose built men's shed and Waroona Health & Community Centre \$124,000 towards an

In 2014 the Advisory Committee distributed \$325,000 in grants to local organisations.

# ALCOA WAROONA SUSTAINABILITY FUND 2015 GRANTS

Community groups and organisations in the Shire of Waroona are invited to submit applications for grants from the Alcoa Waroona Sustainability Fund.

The Sustainability Fund purpose is to fund facilities and projects with enduring value for the communities surrounding the Wagerup refinery. Funds will be allocated to community organisations, initiatives, processes and activities that contribute to the local government region known as the Shire of Waroona.

The closing date for applications is 9 October 2015.

The Advisory Committee has set an upper limit of \$250,000 it may distribute in this round and the individual amount will be dependent on the strength of the applications, however, it is expected that no individual application will be less than \$10,000 nor exceed and amount of \$50,000.

To be eligible you must be an incorporated community group and/or organisation who is domiciled and provides services predominately within the Shire of Waroona including, but not limited to, Waroona, Lake Clifton, Preston Beach, Nanga Brook, Wagerup and Hamel.

Applications can be for a broad range of community development projects both large and small that make a positive contribution to the economic, social, recreational or environmentally sustainability of the communities within the Shire of Waroona.

Projects that attract matched or partial funding from other sources and promote the concept of co-location (where appropriate) will be encouraged.

#### **Is Your Dog Microchipped?**

The *Dog Act 1976* provides that on and after 1 November 2015, the owner of a dog that has reached three months of age must ensure that the dog is microchipped.

#### How do I get my dog microchipped?

A veterinarian (vet), veterinarian nurse or a person with the relevant qualifications from a registered training provider is able to implant a microchip in your dog.

To find out how you can arrange for your dog to be microchipped, contact your regular vet or local government to obtain information on where you can take your dog to be microchipped.

#### My dog is old and unwell, is it still required to be microchipped?

A dog is exempt from the microchipping requirement if a vet issues a certificate stating that the implantation of a microchip in the dog may adversely affect the health and welfare of the dog. Such a certificate cannot apply in respect of a dog that is under three months of age.

#### When will I be required to prove my dog is microchipped?

When you re-register your dog, you will be required to provide proof that the dog has been microchipped, by providing the local government with the microchip number.

#### How will microchipping my dog assist me?

If you lose your microchipped dog, it will make it easier for you to be reunited. The dog's microchip can be scanned by the ranger or a vet, which will reveal the owner's contact details.

If your dog is impounded and it is discovered that it has not been microchipped, you may be liable for a fine. As a result, it is in your best interests to ensure your dog is microchipped.

# What happens if I do not get my dog microchipped?

A person who fails to ensure their dog is microchipped on and after 1 November 2015 is liable for a fine of up to \$5.000.
