#### **President's Message**

I have pleasure in presenting the 2023/24 budget to the ratepayers and residents of the Shire of Waroona. Everyone who engages in our community has a link to this budget through the roads you travel on or the infrastructure or services you may use. We all contribute in some way toward our community and this document is a demonstration of how that commitment is captured and redirected in the most responsible way possible.

Matching income to expectations is a constant pressure for all Local Governments. Maintaining not only continuous recurring costs with what seems to be new and increasing demands are a never-ending journey that Council navigates. It's not an impossible task, but one that must be undertaken with an accountable and measured approach.

This budget cycle has also adopted an improved equity model for all ratepayers with the introduction of differential rating for some land uses across our Shire. While Council is conscious of the increasing costs that we are all experiencing, this budget will include a modest increase. It is worth noting that the average projected rate increase for the past five years has been below forecasts.

The 2023/24 budget period will see the conclusion of the first stage of the Town Centre Revitalisation Strategy with the completion of our Town Centre precinct. Work will also continue on improvements to the area around the Drakesbrook Weir. A robust roads and services programme and infrastructure maintenance schedule has been developed and will have appropriate revenue attributed to fund these in this budget.

This budget period will see significant expenditure of the grants that we have been successful in attracting. These grants are vital for our community to realise parts of our Strategic Plan and have taken significant advocacy and work to bring them through to reality. These new community improvements are a focus on improving liveability and a significant investment in our youth. The Shire has experienced modest growth over the last few years. There are genuine signs that demand is very strong for housing in our Shire and Council is engaged in providing long term relevant infrastructure to compliment our residents' needs.

Our Council has a competent and very capable Corporate Services team. The body of work that evolves in formulating a budget is significant and we are appreciative of the efforts in getting the budget to adoption. I encourage everyone to delve into this budget and Council looks forward to delivering it to our ratepayers over the next twelve months.

#### Rates, Charges & Fee Information 2023/24

In accordance with the Local Government Act 1995 and the Waste Avoidance & Resource Recovery Act 2007, the Council of the Shire of Waroona determines rates and rubbish charges that will be imposed for 2023/24.



This is carried out by calculating a rate in the dollar for both GRV (Gross Rental Value) properties and UV (Unimproved Value) properties.

In addition, the Council imposes a minimum rate on all land, in both town sites and rural areas. These minimum rates are imposed to ensure a fair and equitable amount of rates is payable by all ratepayers.

For details of the above rates, please refer to your rate notice and the following information.

#### **Rubbish/Recycling Charge**

All residents with a rubbish service charge will receive a tip pass at the bottom of their rates notice with twelve (12) entry permits if you have a street collection service. These passes must be presented at the tip gate. Each pass permits the disposal of a 1m3 domestic waste (or equivalent). This must be presented at the tip gate for access. Residents outside the refuse collection area are entitled to a rural tip pass with twenty-four (24) entry permits which must be presented at the tip gate. Each pass permits the disposal of a 1m3 domestic waste (or equivalent). In accordance with Western Australia's Waste Avoidance Regulations, all properties within the Shire of Waroona are charged a separate waste levy for the provision of waste service facilities. Residents with a street collection service are also charged a fee for that service.

#### Please also note the following:

- Please do not lose this pass. Lost, missing or used up passes will not be replaced.
- Tipping fees can be paid at the gate (by either Eftpos, cash or cheque).
- One cubic metre of rubbish is permitted to be disposed of per ticket.
- Proof of identity as a resident or ratepayer of the shire is required prior to the disposal of rubbish at the refuse site.
- Tipping Fees will apply unless a valid tip pass is presented at the gate this includes fees for green waste.

#### **Rates Charges & Fees Due and Payable**

The Rates and Rubbish charge is due and payable by Friday 22 September 2023 at 4pm. This includes the first payment by instalments should this option be selected.

#### **Penalty Interest**

This interest is charged 11% annually, calculated and applied monthly. Interest will be charged on overdue rates and instalments when the instalment payment becomes overdue.

#### **Pensioners/Seniors**

Pensioners and/or Seniors may be eligible to claim rebates up to a maximum of 50% for pensioners (capped at \$750.00) and 25% for seniors (capped at \$100.00) of their current year rates and ESL charges.

The Council does not administer the laws in regards to pensioner concessions. If you wish to lodge a complaint regarding the capping of the pensioner rebate you will need to contact your local Member of Parliament.

#### To qualify for a rebate, applicants must:

- a) Own and occupy the property as their ordinary place of residence as of 1 July, and hold a current Pensioner Concession Card, or
- b) Hold a current Seniors Card, or
- c) Hold a current Seniors & Commonwealth Seniors Health Card, or
- d) Hold a State Concession Card.

To have a rebate granted, pensioners/seniors must be registered with the Council within 35 days of the issue of their rate notice i.e., Friday 22 September 2023. Eligible pensioners are exempt from all interest and administrative charges within the current rating year. To receive a rebate pensioners/seniors must have their rates paid by 30 June 2024. Failing to pay by this date will result in the loss of the rebate and penalty interest being applied.

#### **Objects and Reasons for Rates**

The Council resources are limited. It receives funding from State and Federal Government sources and from direct payment for services such as halls and recreation centres, but these are not sufficient to meet the expenditure required to fulfil Council's objectives and responsibilities in terms of services delivered to ratepayers.

The difference between total revenue required and income is the amount which must be raised through rates.

#### **Alternative Arrangements**

In special circumstances ratepayers experiencing difficulty in paying rates and charges should contact the Rates Officer on 9733 7800 as soon as possible to discuss alternative arrangements.

#### **Emergency Services Levy (ESL) - Rates and Charges**

Property owners pay a levy rate that is proportional to the level of emergency services available to them. This is achieved by the classification of different areas of Western Australia into five categories, each with their own ESL rate.

#### **ESL Charges**

ESL minimum and maximum charges are set to ensure that fair contributions are made by different types of property owners. The following table shows property usage classifications and the minimum & maximum charges that will apply to each in 2023/24.

#### **Payment Options for Rates**

#### **Option 1 Full Payment**

Payment in full, no later than Friday 22 September 2023 at 4pm - eligible for electronic prize incentive draw.

**Please Note:** Payments must be **receipted** at the Shire Office by 4pm Friday 22 September 2023 to be eligible for the rates incentive prize draw. Please allow time for mail delivery, processing times etc.

#### **Option 2 Payment by two instalments**

First instalment due – Friday 22 September 2023 at 4pm Second instalment due – Wednesday 22 November 2023 at 4pm **Cost of this option** - \$10.00 plus interest at the rate of 5.5% on the second instalment.

#### **Option 3 Payment by Four Equal Instalments**

First Instalment due – Friday 22 September 2023 at 4pm Second Instalment due – Wednesday 22 November 2023 at 4pm Third Instalment due – Monday 22 January 2024 at 4pm Fourth Instalment due – Friday 22 March 2024 at 4pm

**Cost of this option** - \$30.00 plus interest at the rate of 5.5% on the second, third and fourth instalment.

Note: Payment of a rate or rubbish charge may not be made by instalments if at the date for payment of the first instalment any part of a rate or charge from a previous financial year remains unpaid. All arrears must therefore be paid by the due date of the first instalment Friday 22 September 2023 at 4pm.

## Consequences of Default in Payment of Rates and Charges

If any rates and service charges remain unpaid after the 22 September 2023 and are not subject to one of the instalment payment options offered, the amount owing is due and payable in full and may be recovered, together with the cost of proceedings, in a court of competent jurisdiction.

#### **BPAY**:

Your unique reference number is located at the bottom of your rates notice.

#### Centrepay

Centrepay is a free direct billpaying service offered to customers receiving payments from Centrelink.

Through Centrepay you can choose to pay rates by having a regular amount deducted from your Centrelink payment. To pay your rates through Centrepay deductions contact Services Australia via www.servicesaustralia.gov.au/centrepay

#### **Rubbish Removal Services**

#### **Residential & Commercial Rubbish & Recycling Collection**

The Shire of Waroona provides a weekly 240 litre rubbish bin collection and a fortnightly 240 litre recycling bin collection. Collections are generally on Wednesday and Thursday however please contact the Shire Administration Office to confirm your collection days. The Shire now offers commercial premises a bulk bin service that is available with 1.5m, 3m and 4.5m sized skip bins. General waste bins are serviced weekly and recycle fortnightly. Please contact the Shire Administration office to arrange this service.

Properties with buildings on them in the kerbside collection zone are charged an annual fee for the kerbside collection service. Additionally, in accordance with Western Australia's Waste Avoidance Regulations, all properties within the Shire of Waroona are charged a separate waste levy for the provision of waste services such as the Buller Road Waste facility.

#### **Hard Waste Collection**

Council provides a town site street verge side 'hard waste' collection service every second year. The Shire has engaged a contractor to undertake the collection which is scheduled to take place in January 2024. Confirmed dates will be provided closer to the date. Residents are encouraged to refer to the Hard Waste Collection Policy and Guidelines.

#### **Rubbish Tip Contractor**

Council has appointed a site management contractor to manage the tip under certain hours and conditions. The tip will be locked outside these hours. Please note that the tip contractor has sole rights to the salvage at the tip and will not be allowing any scavenging.

#### **Buller Road Refuse Site**

The rubbish disposal site is situated approximately 11km southwest of the Waroona Town site along Buller Road and is available for disposal of rubbish between 10am and 4pm Thursday to Tuesday (closed Wednesday) excluding Christmas Day, New Years Day and Good Friday. A tip pass must be presented, or a gate fee paid at the tip to dispose of rubbish.

Tip passes are attached to your Rates Notice and are provided to all rateable properties. Rates and charges for disposal of rubbish will be displayed at the tip entry and will also be available from the Shire of Waroona administration office or can be viewed on the Shire's website.

#### Asbestos

People intending to deposit asbestos at the landfill site must first contact the Shire of Waroona to ensure that the material is disposed of in a correct and safe manner, in accordance with regulations. Asbestos will not be accepted unless it is wrapped in accordance with regulations. All applicable rates and charges will apply for all asbestos presented.

#### **Green Waste**

Green waste can be dumped with a tip pass up to the volume stated on the pass. All other green waste presented will attract the applicable rates and charges.

#### **Car Bodies/Scrap Steel**

Car bodies/scrap steel can be dumped with a tip pass up to the volume stated on the pass. All other car bodies/scrap steel presented will attract the applicable rates and charges.

#### Mattresses

Mattresses can be dumped with a tip pass. Once all the entry permits on the pass have been used a disposal fee will apply.

#### **Fridges and Freezers**

Fridges and Freezers can be dumped with a tip pass however once all the entry permits on the tip pass have been used a disposal fee will apply. It is also important to note that they must be degassed prior to dumping for safety reasons. If they have not been de-gassed, then a de-gassing fee will be charged prior to disposal.

#### Transport of Rubbish

Due care should be taken when transporting rubbish to the waste facility. All loads shall be secured. Insecure loads are classed as littering under the Litter Act 1979 and infringement notices may be issued.

#### **Ranger Information**

Drakesbrook Weir is located 3 km southeast of the Waroona townsite – swim, fish, and canoe (no power boats), picnic or barbeque. Undulating hills provide a picturesque backdrop to this popular day use area with shaded tables, free electric barbeques, and public facilities. Dogs are prohibited in the grassed area, in the water or along the water's edge but they are permitted on leash in other areas.

Preston Beach is a very popular fishing and recreational destination. Road registered 4-wheel drive vehicles are permitted on the beach (unless closed). Tyre pressures should be reduced and a 20kph speed limit applies. Vehicles are strictly prohibited from entering the sand dunes or the recreational swimming zone. Camping is strictly prohibited in all areas including the car park, beach, and dune areas. Camping is permitted in the designated RV camping area and only for self-contained recreational vehicles (subject to conditions), for not more than 48 hours.

#### **Resource Sharing Agreement**

The Shire of Waroona has a resource sharing agreement with the Shire of Murray Ranger Services to provide an enhanced service to the community. Ranger Services can be contacted on 9531 7777 or via email at mailbag@murray.wa.gov.au

#### Dogs

 All dogs over the age of 3 months must be microchipped and registered with the Shire. Sterilisation and microchip certificates and/or proof of exemption is required. Dog registrations can be obtained for a 1 year, 3 year or lifetime period. Dangerous dogs can only be registered 1 year at a time.

A 50% discount is given to Eligible Pensioner Concession Card Holders. Dogs used for droving or tending stock are 25% of the above fees (a Statutory Declaration to support a bona fide working dog concession claim is required). Please ensure that you can effectively confine your dog(s) within your premises to prevent them from escaping. Please ensure your dog is always on a leash when walking it in a public place.

The maximum number of dogs allowed is 2 unless your property is situated on rural or special rural zoned land where a maximum of 4 is allowed. An exemption application to keep more than the prescribed number of dogs is required if you wish to keep more than the above but less than 6. The exemption application fee is \$100.00 and is non-refundable.

#### Cats

- All cats over the age of 6 months must be sterilised, microchipped, and registered with the Shire. Sterilisation and microchip certificates and/ or proof of exemption is required. Cat registrations can be obtained for a 1 year, 3 year or lifetime period. A 50% discount is given to Eligible Pensioner Concession Card Holders.
- The maximum number of cats allowed is 2\*. A permit is required to keep 3 or more cats. Where an owner has 3 or more registered cats prior to 21 June 2023, that owner is not required to have a permit: however, that owner cannot substitute or replace any cat (more than 3 cats) once the relevant cat dies or is permanently removed from the premise. The permit application fee is \$100.00 and is non-refundable.
- If you apply to be an approved cat breeder you will need to provide proof
  of membership with either Control Council of Western Australia (FCCWA),
  Australian National Cats (ANCATS) or Cat Owners Association of Western
  Australia (COAWA). A breeding cat fee of \$100.00 is also required to be
  paid per cat annually.

#### **Native Animals**

There is a Wildcare Helpline that is a 24/7 telephone referral service. The helpline is operated by volunteers on behalf of the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions and is based at the Head Office in Kensington.

The Helpline provides a service for the public who find sick, injured, or orphaned native wildlife and are seeking advice on where to find care for the animal. If you've found sick, injured or orphaned native wildlife please call the 24-hour Wildcare Helpline on (08) 9474 9055.

#### **Disposal of Deceased Animals**

You are required to dispose of deceased animals at the Buller Road Refuse Site. Deceased animals will be accepted with a tip pass up to the volume stated on the pass. All other deceased animals presented will attract the applicable rates and charges.

#### Wandering Livestock

Wandering livestock poses a significant safety risk to the community. If you own livestock, it is your responsibility to ensure that they cannot escape from your property. It is an offence for livestock to wander under the *Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1960.* Additionally, you may be liable to civil proceedings if it is found that your wandering livestock contributed to personal injury or property damage.

Please ensure your fences are maintained in good order so as to contain all livestock to the property.

#### Fire Control Information 2023/24

Pursuant to Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, all owners and/or occupiers of land are required to carry out fire prevention work in accordance with the Firebreak Notice on or before 30 November each calendar year or within 14 days of the date of becoming the owner or occupier of the land, should this be after 30 November. All work specified in the Firebreak Notice is to be maintained up to and including 15 May the following calendar year.

#### Harvest & Vehicle Movement Bans SMS Register

The Shire of Waroona provides a free of charge Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban (HVMB) notification service via SMS alert. As soon as a HVMB is implemented, all mobile phones registered to the service receive a SMS

Please note that the Shire may impose a HVMB when the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer is of the opinion that the use of engines, vehicles, plant, or machinery is likely to cause a fire or be conducive to the spread of a bushfire.

#### Building, Planning, Health & Swimming Pool **Inspection Planning Approval**

#### Planning Approval

Planning approval from the Shire is required for a range of circumstances such as: Amendments to the building envelopes

- Clearing of vegetation (where not exempt)
- Retaining walls +0.5m in height
- Commercial and industrial development/uses: and Change of use e.g., Holiday home, home business

#### Building Approval

Building from the Shire is required for a range of structures such as:

- New Dwelling, additions, and alterations to existing dwellings
- Roof replacement Sheds +10m2
- Swimming pools, spas, and their safety barriers
- Patio, verandas, gazebo, or lean-tos +20m2 Retaining walls +0.5m in height and
- Commercial buildings including industrial and public buildings.

- Health Approval Health Approval from the Shire if required for a range of activities such as:
- Food Business operation commercial kitchen, and home kitchen .
- Hair Dressing or Skin Penetration operation, at home or commercial
- Poperation of Lodging House, Bed & Breakfast, Caravan Parks, and Temporary Accommodation Event Applications including Trading in Public Places and Temporary Food Stalls; and Effluent Treatment Systems permits to construct and permits to use.

#### Keeping of Animals, Birds or Poultry

Regardless of the type of animal, bird or poultry, all property owners/occupiers are required to keep the premises free from animal excrement and food waste, or any other material that may be injurious to health or attract vermin, within proximity to a habitable dwelling

Within a townsite no more than twelve (12) poultry and pigeons may be kept. Roosters, geese, turkeys, peafowls, and gamebirds are not permitted to be kept on properties of 2 hectares or less without written approval from the Shire. The Shire may revoke an approval if animals, birds, or poultry are causing a nuisance or is injurious or dangerous to public health.

 Swimming Pool Barrier Inspections
 The Shire will carry out inspections on swimming pool barriers to ensure they comply with requirements.
 The first inspection cost is included in your rates. Additional costs may result if there is non-compliance and further inspections are required
