


Our Recovery Journey - Anniversary Reflections

What's been going on?

Thanks to the Peel Development Commission and the Royalties for Regions fund the shires new Emergency generator is up and running. With this years weather it has been put through its paces three times already and has proven its worth. Thanks for all those who have supported the shire and community in achieving this goal.

Emergency Supplies

Thanks Harvey Water for suppling Fire hydrant fittings have to the region's firefighting brigades to provide greater access to water in strategic locations in the Waroona Shire.

There will be demonstrations and training for the shire Bush Fire Brigades on how to attach and operate the fittings.

The system converts the irrigation system into a fire hydrant in case of an emergency, the intent is every firefighting unit in the shire will be equipped with these hydrants.

As part of the training brigades will be supplied with a map which details the location of the 15 valve sites. This will shorten the time firefighters have to take to refill and then get back to the fire ground.
