5. ANY OTHER GENERAL BUSINESS

5.1 Mr Kenneth Landwehr

The following question and statement was presented to the meeting by K. Ferraro on behalf of K. Landwehr.

"Would you be kind enough to advise if any planning for National Bank Waroona remaining open has taken place from a Shire perspective.

As a concerned ratepayer and bank customer I believe the writing is on the wall to permanently close the local branch.

Over the past five months the branch has been closed for short spells with staff shortages and also more recently on Fridays with an early unexpected finish.

Suggestions:

Clout of Shire of Waroona accounts, Charles Hull Contracting and Hull families, Charla Downs Pty Ltd is a sample of high rating customers. Engage the help of our Federal Member with a team approach to head office with a Strategic Analysis for Waroona NAB Branch remaining open. The current local branch Manager is serving 4 branches including Manjimup. Statistics that Waroona has an ageing population and likely to need more help. Even though 10 years ago the NAB used to conduct an agency at Quambie Park Waroona to ensure customers received priority attention.

Four months ago I assisted a disabled age person withdraw funds from the ATM with very poor eye sight and lack of experience using such machinery to obtain cash having ridden his gopher down probably from Quambie Park. He thanked me profusely afterwards. A small proactive rural community could survive as the "Town with no Beer" but as the small rural town with "No Bank" would be disastrous and Mandurah branch taking up a lot of the slack.

I would be happy to sit on any subcommittee or working party to ensure closure does not automatically happen without Waroona Community showing some resolution like the Waroona/Yarloop Fires 6/7 years ago.

Mr Landwehr's question and statement was discussed, and the following motion provided:
