We managed to quickly visit the next stage completed in the day use area at the Historic Lime Kiln at Lake Clifton that has included upgraded walk trails and interpretation signage. Congratulations to the Lake Clifton-Heron Residents Association for the effort in capturing this part of our Shire's history and working with the environment on this project. Council currently has quite a few calls for submissions on a variety of issues that have an effect on our Shire. PLEASE REMEMBER - you need to obtain written consent BEFORE clearing any natural vegetation or mature trees!

Written permission is also required - before undertaking any activity in a Shire Road Reserve. It is also illegal to take any wood alive or dead from a Shire Reserve.

For the clearing of vegetation, you can contact the Shire's planning services. A Shire officer will work with you to establish if you need to get an assessment done on your site, in relation declared and engendered flora and fauna, as well as wetlands and waterways. Your property may also be subject to a 'conservation convent' preventing land clearing. Please be Aware: Property owners and machinery operators, who clear land without approval may be prosecuted, fined and/or ordered to rehabilitate.
