Local Government Act 1995 Cat Act 2011 **Shire of Waroona Adoption of Cat Local Law 2023**

The Shire of Waroona has resolved to make the Shire of Waroona Cat Local Law 2023.

The purpose of this local law is to encourage responsible cat ownership and to provide for the effective management of cats within the Shire of

The effect of this local law is that persons who own or keep a cat within the Shire of Waroona are to comply with the provisions of this local law.

A copy of the proposed local law may be inspected at or obtained from the Shire's Administration Office at 52 Hesse Street, Waroona, between 8.30am and 4.00pm Monday to Friday. A copy is also on the Shire's website www.waroona.wa.gov.au

The local law was published in the Government Gazette on 9 June 2023 and will come into operation on 23 June 2023.
