AGE FRIENDLY COMMUNITY PLAN At our last Council meeting, Council adopted a recommendation for the 2016 Age Friendly Community prepared by Storybox Consulting, used for future reference purposes in the review and preparation of relevant local strategies. In developing this Plan, we worked with the Shire of Murray to engage with service providers and residents across both Shires. We, along with our community, have recognised the need to plan to provide for an ageing community and importantly, at the same time, keep our existing family structures intact. This Plan proposes a range of broad strategies looking at for example, sustainable transport options, outdoor spaces and buildings designed to meet the needs of seniors, which in turn will ensure accessibility and safety for all residents. Other actions would encourage suitable housing options, attract community support and health services, encourage and support opportunities that enhance social participation and also encourage and promote volunteering and employment opportunities for seniors.

This Plan will serve as a strong, high level direction to Council on what are the key important aspirations required to ensure the wellbeing of our growing ageing population for the years ahead. The Shire of Waroona recognises the wonderful contribution of older people in our community and we must work hard to ensure that their efforts are acknowledged by providing a safe, healthy and importantly, enjoyable way of life. The Age-Friendly Community Plan is for five years with a review every two years. It will provide many challenges, and as such, I encourage everyone to treat this as a living document and to maintain the momentum.
