#### COMMUNITY SAFETY & CRIME PREVENTION PLAN REVIEW

The Shire has commenced a review of its Community Safety & Crime Prevention Plan. This review will be undertaken in collaboration with local police, relevant stakeholders, organisations and agencies, and the community. Surveys are now available for completion by residents to assist in identifying issues and opportunities to be considered in the update of the Plan.

Through the WA Police Community Engagement Division, 133 local governments have developed Community Safety & Crime Prevention Plans, and this unit will work with the Shire to help facilitate and develop an updated Plan to promote holistic crime prevention within the community.
