EDDIE ON THE ROAD

During the Queen's Birthday long weekend, children aged between 7 and 12 years were able to take part in the FREE Edmund Rice Camps WA Eddie on the Road program.

Eddie on the Road began in mid-2011 as Edmund Rice Camps WA wished to reach a broader area of communities and kids in need. Because of the difficulties with country kids reaching their metropolitan camps, this initiative allows Edmund Rice Camps WA to bring the camps to them, basically creating a travelling camp where kids from far and wide can be reached, to have fun and make a difference.

There was a wide range of activities for local kids to get involved in over the two days, including many typical camp activities such as games, sports, arts and crafts, and much more! It's important to note, however, that the program was not just purely about recreation, but the volunteers' role modelled good behaviour and leadership qualities which were passed onto kids in attendance.

All resources were supplied along with experienced ERCWA staff and volunteers to facilitate the

programs, in partnership with local representatives from Waroona Youth Advisory Council.

Since 2011, successful programs have been run in Yalgoo, Meekatharra, Leonora, Kalgoorlie, Kurrawang, Brookton, Broome, Paraburdoo, Moora and Tom Price and it is hoped that Eddie on the Road can provide this program to the Shire in the long-term.



TROUT FEST

What a turnout for the 2nd annual community freshwater fish stocking event - Trout Fest!

On Saturday, 1st September, just in time for Father's Day weekend, over 600 people helped release thousands of rainbow trout into the Drakesbrook Weir (along with a few big brown trout too). Shire President Cr Mike Walmsley opened the event, welcoming visitors to Waroona, and encouraging them to support local businesses during their visit.

Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) announced a licence free weekend, presenting the perfect opportunity for families, friends and the community to spend quality time together releasing trout and freshwater fishing.

As well as the fish release, Trout Fest also include freshwater fishing tuition for all ages, an education display by DPIRD, fly casting, freshwater tackle and rigging information and demonstrations, and general fishing time for everyone to have a go at freshwater fishing for

free. This year Getaway Outdoors joined in the fun, offering free Hobie kayak and stand up paddle board demonstrations and trials. The Leos Club of Waroona kept the masses well fed with a sausage which was under constant demand.

This event would not be possible without the collaboration of the Shire of Waroona, Recfishwest, Fisheries WA, WA Trout & Freshwater Angling Association, Australian Trout Foundation, Getaway Outdoors, Leos Club of Waroona, and many volunteers.
