On the 28th of January, as part of the Shire's Youth Mental Health Program, 24 young people from the shire were sent to start a unique and personal five day journey at the Kerem Adventure Camp in Bullsbrook. Participants were kept busy with workshops and clinics, with visits from West



Coast Eagles, Fremantle Dockers, West Coast Fever, Perth Wildcats, Hockeyroos, Perth Scorchers and Brent Garvey. The camp taught the youth of Waroona how to help others who are struggling with a mental illness/suicide, understand themselves on a deeper level, work in a team in difficult situations, and how to live a healthy lifestyle – all while promoting the link between physical and mental wellbeing. The camp was a success in opening the youth up to new possibilities and building their confidence to overcome fears. The camp gave each participant the tools to lead a better future not only for themselves but for the people around them. 
# WAROONA COMMUNITY DIRECTORY


The directory will also include listings for public services, health services, schools, government departments, members of parliaments, and justice of the peace.

#### **BRIDGE REPAIR WORK ON CORONATION RD, WAROONA**



Commencing 11 February 2019, Water Corporation's authorised contractor Fulton Hogan, will undertake work to repair a bridge located on Coronation Road in the Shire of Waroona to improve the safety and long-term reliability of this bridge.

As part of this work, the bridge will be closed from 18 February to 10 March 2019. Detours will be in place throughout the work as indicated in the map below. The bridge will have one lane available at all other times.

Traffic management will be in place, we urge you to take extra care around the work area and observe the instructions of traffic management personnel and signage.

Work is expected to be completed by May 2019.
