INCOME

RATING

A general rate revenue increase of 2.64% has been applied for the 2019/20 financial year realising total rates of \$5,017,802. This increase is 1.36% less than that which was forecast in the Council's Long Term Financial Plan. Minimum rates have been increased from \$1,115 to \$1,145.

The Council has experienced a revaluation of UV rated properties as conducted by the Valuer General resulting in very little movement in values, however ratepayers should note that their individual rate assessments may vary from the amount stated above.

RUBBISH/RECYCLING

The annual household levy for rubbish/recycling will increase from \$290 to \$300 per annum. A portion of this income is used to fund future capital works at the Buller Road Refuse Site.

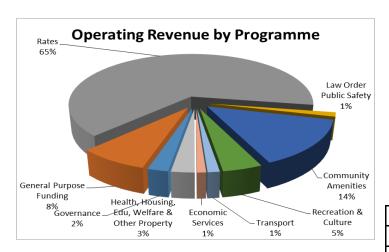
