COUNCIL BUDGET 2014/15

The Shire of Waroona 2014/15 budget was adopted by the Council at a special Council meeting held on the 18th August 2014. This budget follows the 4 year Corporate Business plan and the Community Strategic plan.

Other factors considered during the preparation of this budget include;

- 1. The level of Royalties for Regions funding which are to be used for two of Councils largest capital works projects; Coronation road bridge and Hesse
- 2. Grants for one off capital works
- 3. Ongoing grants such as road works grants
- 4. Asset management requirements
- 5. User fees and charges

With limited resources and a diverse range of services to provide for community expectations, preparation of the budget continues to be a challenging task.

RATES NOTICES ARE OUT

Shire of Waroona rate notices will start to arrive in letterboxes for approximately 2700 properties commencing the week of the 2nd September. The mail out is the initial rate run of the 2014/15 financial year with rate payments due by the 8th of October 2014. Council continues to make it as convenient as possible to pay rates with a range of instalment and payment options available. Tip passes will be attached to the base of all notices where the ratepayers is paying a service fee for rubbish and recycling. Ratepayers who own a rural property with a dwelling will be required to collect their rural tip pass from the Shire of Waroona Administration Office.

In addition to your rate notice, your envelope will also contain an information booklet which will include all you need to know about your local Shire. To assist in the rates process, please ensure your current mailing address is correct. Ratepayers who have not received their rate notice as a result of change of address (change of address is required in writing), will continue to be subject to debt recovery action for late payment of rates. It is your responsibility to contact us should you not receive your notice.

Should you be eligible for a pensioner/senior rebate on your property please ensure your application is submitted as soon as possible. To be eligible for a 50% pension rebate you must hold a current pensioner concession card or a commonwealth seniors health card and a seniors card. To be eligible for a 25% senior rebate you must hold a current seniors card. To be eligible you must be the owner of the property and reside there as your permanent place of address as of the 1st of July 2014. You may also apply for a rebate for your shire rates by calling the Water Corporation on 1300 659 951.

Completed forms need to be returned by 3pm Friday September 19. Exhibition pieces do not need to be ready until Tuesday October 21st, the date they are required to be delivered to the Visitor

Artists and artisans met recently to network and learn more about this year's exhibition. "We have some outstanding new talent to complement the great depth and variety from our regular exhibitors," said Event Coordinator Tracy Goldsworthy.

"This combination sees Sea to ART set to be a great success yet again and it's a wonderful platform for the many

It is always interesting to see art expressed in so many ways and over the last seven years visitors to the exhibition have been treated to an impressive show of talent in a wide range of media.

Examples include a working model ship's cannon, handcrafted knives, furniture, intarsia, sculpted bowls and a variety of timber boxes entered in the fine wood and metal work categories.

Sculptures have included the mediums of cold porcelain, newfound art, ceramic, clay, Paverpol and plaster & gum. The largest category, painting and drawing, has seen an incredible array of artworks in oils, pastels, acrylics, watercolours, charcoal, acrylic & resin, pencils and pen & ink.

Printmaking has included linocut prints,

artists and artisans in dry point etching and collograph prints.

> Artworks in fibre and textiles bring another layer of texture and warmth to the displays and over the years the pieces have been many and varied - stump work and thread art, and throws, rugs, purses and bags incorporating beads, fine silk, merino wool and nuno felt to name

Mixed media caters from the beautiful to the quirky and entries over the years have included glass plates, jewellery and mosaics, a painted cross-cut saw, gourd and goatskin banjos and bonsai in railway sleeper planter boxes. And in 2009, adding a touch of humour, a pickling jar full of 'stocking' bottoms was a crowd favourite and aptly entitled Pickled Bums.
